

PREVENTATIVE CARE FOR YOUR NEW KITTEN

Kittens are susceptible to many diseases due to their immature immune systems. There are core and non-core vaccines available. Core vaccines are recommended in all kittens because these diseases are more serious and potentially fatal.

Ideally, kittens should receive their first core vaccines between 6-8 weeks of age and have them boosted every 3-4 weeks up until about 16 weeks of age. Rabies is given between 12-16 weeks of age and usually with the final FVRCP vaccine. Your pet's vaccine schedule will be discussed at your visit.
