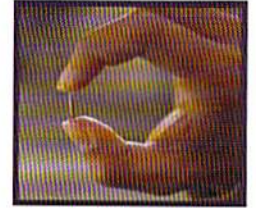


MICROCHIPS

Microchipping your pet is the only way to have a permanent form of identification to link you to your pet should he/she ever become lost. Even if your pet stays indoors, unexpected events such as natural disasters, house fires, and other unplanned incidents often leave pets unprotected.

Microchips are the size of a grain of rice and implanted underneath your pet's skin, in between his/her shoulder blades. They can be implanted anytime but during the time of spaying/neutering, while they are anesthetized, is ideal. The microchip can't be removed or fall out. After it is implanted, it will be registered to your name. If your pet is ever lost or



found and brought into a shelter/rescue/hospital, he/she will be scanned for a microchip. Your pet's microchip number will be displayed on the scanner, so you can be contacted.



WHAT TO EXPECT AT YOUR FIRST ADULT ANNUAL VISIT

Once your pet has received his/her last series of vaccinations, your next boosters will not be due for a year. This visit will be your pet's first adult annual exam. During this appointment your veterinarian will do a completely physical exam and booster any vaccines that are due.

CATS:

- Complete physical exam
- Fecal testing
- Rabies vaccine will be boosted annually
- FVRCP vaccine will be boosted at 1 year of age then every three years
- Leukemia vaccine will be boosted annually if pet goes outdoors
- Pick up more preventatives, if needed.

DOGS:

- Complete physical exam
- Fecal testing
- Rabies and Da2PP vaccine will be boosted at one year of age then every three years
- Bordetella/Leptospirosis/Lyme vaccines will be boosted annually
- Heartworm testing
- Pick up more preventatives, if needed.
