

PREVENTATIVE CARE FOR YOUR NEW PUPPY

Puppies are susceptible to many diseases due to their immature immune systems. There are core and non-core vaccines available. Core vaccines are recommended in all dogs because these diseases are more serious and potentially fatal.

Ideally, puppies should receive their first core vaccines between 6-8 weeks of age and have them boosted every 3-4 weeks up until about 16 weeks of age. Rabies is given between 12-16 weeks of age and usually with the final DHPP vaccine. Your pet's vaccine schedule will be discussed at your visit.

- ◆ Intestinal parasites can be a potential threat for your puppy, and sometimes transmitted to humans.
- ◆ Heartworm disease is a very serious illness transmitted by mosquitos.
